

Chapters 10-12 in the Provider Guide to Achieving NAFCC Accreditation (P.G.) offer detailed information regarding your observation visit and accreditation decision.

The Observer Will NOT

- Mentor or offer advice
- Play with the children
- Eat lunch with you and the children
- Collect your parent surveys or other observation materials
- Give feedback on the visit

The Observation Packet

Anatomu

You will receive your observation packet the month prior to your visit. It includes the Self-Certified Standards book, parent surveys, provider's evaluation of the observer, conflict of interest affidavit, and the observer's NAFCC Serial #. Read all instructions thoroughly. Refer to Chapter 10 in the P.G.

Parent Surveys

Parent surveys are another way of assessing that you meet the standards. Distribute parent surveys and collect completed surveys in sealed envelopes from each family enrolled in your program. If your enrollment has changed notify NAFCC.

The Visit

The visit will last 4-5 hours. The observer must see the arrival or departure of children, so they typically plan to arrive when children will be arriving. They will document evidence that you meet the standards. After 4-5 hours the observer will take a break and leave your home to prepare for the interview. Refer to Chapter 11 in the P.G.

After Your Observation Visit

Within 48 hours of the visit being complete return the following items to NAFCC.

- Evaluation of Observer
- Signed Self-certified Standards
- Sealed Parent Surveys
- · Signed Conflict of Interest Statement

Self-Certified Standards

bservation

Complete your *Self-Certified Standards* prior to your observation visit. Score each standard and write how you meet the standard. The *Self-Certified Standards* measures compliance of those standards that require confidentiality or which might be intrusive to the program to be observed.

Preparing for the Visit

Use the *Benchmarks* to complete your final evaluation of your program. Let parents know the month the visit is scheduled and remind them how important it is for their children to be present. Prepare the children for a visitor. Refer to Chapter 10 in the P.G.

The Interview

The interview will last about 1.5 hours. It is best to plan on having someone available to help with the children during the interview. At this time you will have the opportunity to respond regarding standards scored less than fully met or not observed. There are also scripted questions for you to answer. Be thoughtful and take your time.

Decision

The decision is determined by assessing compiled data from the provider, observer, and parents of children enrolled in your program.

The decision can take up to 8 weeks.

You will be notified of your accreditation decision via mail.

New Developmentally Appropriate Practice (DAP) Child Care Training Curriculum

The Department of Children and Families' Office of Child Care Regulation and Background Screening, in its ongoing effort to provide child care professionals in

Florida with high quality training, has redesigned the Developmentally Appropriate Practice (DAP) Child Care Training Curriculum.

Effective July 1, 2013, the new 10-hour instructor-led courses will replace the current 10-hour DAP courses.

The course titles and acronyms are:

- Infant and Toddler Appropriate Practice (ITAP)
 - Preschool Appropriate Practice (PSAP)
 - School-Age Appropriate Practice (SAAP)

The new 10-hour DAP courses may be used to meet the 10-hour Part II Introductory

Training requirement if the individual successfully completes the course as evidenced by passage of the competency exam associated with course.

Students who complete the old DAP courses by June 30, 2013 will have until December 31, 2013 to pass the corresponding competency exams. Successful completion of the course will be documented on the individual's Child Care Training Transcript. **The competency exams for the old DAP courses will no longer be available after December 31, 2013.**

Individuals who have completed the old DAP courses to meet Part II training requirements do not have to retake the courses, and their existing certificates will remain on their child care training transcript. However, they may choose to take the new courses to earn CEUs or in-service credit only.

Individuals completing any of the courses will have 60 days after course completion to earn CEUs.

The FFCCHA Quarterly Full Board was held Saturday, April 27, 2013 in Ocala. In addition to Full Board members, there were 15 guests welcomed to the meeting. Correspondence to FFCCHA was read from Jeanne Barker to Tammy Tener thanking her for attending the Florida Community College Early Childhood Educator's Network Conference. Tammy had an FFCCHA display and handouts for attendees to take back to Family Child Care students and providers. A letter from the IRS came in for Debbie Pintar requesting updated information on the Chapters. Anne Brooks, Treasurer, sent a letter to Bernard and Lisa Anes concerning information she needed from them for CEUs. Funding is still available for Credential Scholarships. Nominations were taken and voting was done by members in attendance for Volunteer of the Year, Outstanding Teamwork, Officer of the Year, Advocate of the Year, and the Heart Award. ASK OEL?

Relationships: The Heart of Development and Learning

Question: Why is it so import for caregivers to always be consistent?

Answer: As sensory motor learners, infants and toddlers are very in tune with their caregivers and pick up messages based on cues from the caregiver. Recognizing that caring for young children on daily basis can be very demanding and stressful, it is the caregiver's job to remain consistent in their interactions. Infants learn to trust adults through the predictability of caregiver/child interactions. The consistency of these interactions directly impacts the relationship that is built. If we look at Erickson's theory of psychosocial development, one of the stages that occurs from birth to three is "Trust vs. Mistrust." When a child experiences consistent warm and responsive care, he/she learns to trust his/her caregiver. A lack of consistency results in the mistrusting the caregiver. This learning of trust or mistrust will affect the child's ability to develop positive relationships later in life.


Abbie Bill, Mentor Program Chair
