

On a state level, she serves as Area 12 Rep for FFCCHA. Pat is married with one daughter and one son. She is very active in their lives and enjoys reading and volunteering with the Girl Scouts.

In the past 7 years, Pathways to Learning, has been successful in meeting the needs of the children with each child graduating from the program being proficient entering kindergarten. Many apply and are accepted to the public school's Magnet programs. Pat attributes her success as a gift from God to teach, her love for the children, a dedication and determination to prepare each child for educational success, and doing what she was called to do - educating our children!





The FFCCHA Quarterly Full Board Meeting was held February 11, 2012 in Ocala. Chris Cross-Holcomb presented a 30 minute Webinar on Parliamentary Procedures to all in attendance. New funding will be available for Credential Scholarships and additional policies were approved. The June conference comp hotel list was approved. New 3-year contracts were approved for Tammy Tener to continue to serve as FFCCHA Executive Director and Conference Coordinator from July 2012 to September 2015 and with the Sheraton Sand Key Resort Hotel for the 2013-15 June conferences. Funds were also approved to develop a Spanish version of the FFCCHA website and to comp one night hotel room for Area Reps and Chairs at the next Full Board meeting on May 5.

Welcome to Janet Dixon, appointed as the new Secretary to the Executive Board, to fill a vacant position now until June 30, 2014 and to Nancy Dougherty, appointed as Awards Chair (a non-board position). Connie Foster was approved to continue as Membership Officer for another 2-year term starting July 1st. Anne Brooks was appointed Treasurer to fill vacant position now and begin 3 year term on July 1st. Therefore, the Vice President position is now open. Two applications for the President-Elect were accepted. The nominees are Karan Heister and Lynn Gibson for a mailin ballot vote by full members (see page 23). The winner will be announced at the May meeting and will serve as President for 3 years beginning July 1, 2012.

Legislative News – FFCCHA goes to Tallahassee

The Florida Legislative Session started early this year on January 10. The regular legislative session starts on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in March for a period not to exceed 60 days. However, every ten years the regular session is moved to earlier in the year in order to reapportion legislative districts. The dates for the 60-day period of this regular session are fixed by law. March 9, 2012 was the last day of regular session.

There were several bills introduced this session that had the FFCCHA Full Board and providers across the state very concerned. HB 419 would have required large family child care homes to put alarms in their vehicles. We spoke up about this bill and it died in a subcommittee. Many of the

other changes that were being proposed would affect school readiness, Early Learning Coalitions, quality and funding. Of those bills HB 5103 was passed, all others failed. Some of the changes in 5103 will be to the priority of which children will be enrolled and limiting the expenditures for administrative activities, quality activities, and nondirect services. The Florida Office of Early Learning is working on a uniform statewide contract for all school readiness providers. Investigations to fraud and overpayment will be enhanced and followed through with charges. They are developing a funding formula for school readiness payments and Gold Seal rates. Also, during that time we went through the halls of the Capitol speaking to legislators about concerns we had with the different bills. We managed to meet with over 30 legislators and had meetings with Deborah Russo from DCF, Dr. Mel Jurado from OEL, Lauren Faison - Executive Director of the Early Learning Coalition of Big Bend, and Jennifer Seifert - Office of PreK-12 Appropriations Committee. We also gave each of them family child care information

packets (all of the FFCCHA publications in folders prepared by FFCCHA Public Relations Officer, Gwen Wilson).

The Department of Children and Families (DCF) Child Care Program recently conducted a state-wide survey of child care providers to determine customer satisfaction with the regulatory process in 2011. The purpose of the survey, which has been conducted annually since 1998, is to gather information regarding the performance of the Child Care Program (including the Regional Licensing Units) with respect to the Department's licensure, registration, inspection, and technical assistance processes. This survey enables the Child Care Program to provide better customer service by providing valuable information on positive practices that should be continued, as well as aspects of the regulatory process that are opportunities for improvement.

The 2011 survey was conducted electronically via an interactive, web-based survey platform. Invitations to participate in the survey were sent electronically to every child care provider in the state of Florida that had a valid email address in the Child Care Information System database. For the purpose of this article, we will focus on the survey results from following survey respondents: Family Day Care Homes, Registered Family Day Care Homes, and Large Family Child Care Homes.

Statewide, 407 home providers responded to the survey. That number is further broken down as follows: 53 Large Family Child Care Homes, 220 Family Day Care Homes, and 134 Registered Family Day Care Homes. The respondents were asked to respond to questions regarding their satisfaction with the licensing and registration processes, inspection process, and interaction with the Regional Licensing Units. The 2011 survey results showed the highest satisfaction rating ever for the Child Care Program.

In addition, survey respondents were given the opportunity to provide written feedback about their experiences with the Child Care Program. A review of this feedback indicated that there were few concerns, and of those concerns, the majority were resolved to the respondent's satisfaction. Respondents also shared positive feedback, expressing their appreciation of licensing staff and Regional Licensing Units. Below are some examples of the positive feedback received:

"As always very nice and strong staff, very helpful to everyone."

"I have always been pleased with my child care inspector, and the employees at the office. Thank you"

"I think that you are doing a well-deserved job in our communities, and I thank you!"

"The child care licensing has always been so helpful. Information has been mailed as needed promptly as promise. I have gotten questions answered in a timely manner and with great customer service."

The Child Care Program (CCP) appreciates providers for their participation in the survey, as their responses provide valuable information that enables the CCP to enhance customer service and continue to meet the needs of the child care community. 
